The English Department are really getting stuck into the festive spirit this month, focusing on A Christmas Carol for Y10 and a wonderful trip to see a stage performance is planned.


The Languages Department are pleased to welcome Madame Larguet as the new HoD of French and she is already settling in and making an excellent impact. Welcome Madame Larguet!
