Safeguarding update

What is bullying?

Bullying is intentional behaviour that hurts someone else. It includes name calling, hitting, pushing, spreading rumours, threatening or undermining someone. It can happen anywhere. It's usually repeated over a long period of time and can hurt a child both physically and emotionally.

How can you help a child if they're being bullied?

If your child or a child you know experiences bullying, it might make you feel angry, upset, or confused. As a first step, there should be a shared understanding of what bullying is. You should agree that what's happening isn't right and shouldn't continue.
