This month the GCSE Religious Studies pupils joined the Art department to visit Coventry Cathedral and the Herbert Art Gallery.

At the Cathedral, the Religious Studies pupils were taken around by an official tour guide on the theme of "worship". They were able to hear the history of the new and old Cathedrals.

At the Chapel of Unity they were able to play a special game with golf balls to demonstrate how the floor of the chapel is tilted in the middle! They also saw the Millenium chapel and were able to get up close to the special tapestry the Cathedral has; instead of stained-glass windows. They especially enjoyed the enthusiasm of the tour guide.

At the Herbert Gallery they were able to see first hand, the replica of "Dippy the Diplodocus" and had time to view the Blitz exhibition. A thoroughly enjoyable day and the pupils came away with amazing first-hand knowledge.

# **Grooming – Information and Victim Support**

Grooming is when someone falsely gains your trust to persuade or trick you into doing something sexual with them. In the past this occurred in person through manipulation of under-aged individuals by persons older than them.

Over the past few years online relationships between individuals have become normalised. Young people and increasingly children, get to know people they've never met through video games, Instagram, snapchat and other social media. This has gone hand in hand with an increase in child-grooming online. The rise of face changer apps, voice changer apps and loopholes in sectors like the dating apps have led to an increase in this behaviour.
