Science Faculty


As always, the Science department have been very busy. In Science club, they have been modelling a theme park.


Miss Taylor has also been doing dissections with Year 9 and Year 10 have been

Alongside Test the Teacher, our House team is also hosting an Easter Event on the later part of this term.


For our sports enthusiasts, we bring House rowing. May the best house row, row, row the boat into victory!
