**Wednesdays - Hart Values and 5 different British Values**


Heart - Ambition - Respect - Tenacity


**PE Fixture**

On Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> May Hartshill Academy pupils became true engineers and designers, working with industry professionals as they took part in the TeenTech Festival at Mira Hinckley. TeenTech Festivals are highly interactive and inspire young teenagers about the contemporary industries shaping their future.

Led by Maggie Philbin OBE, industry professionals and TV personalities, pupils began the day working in small groups with a variety of engineering companies from FutureSys to Triumph. They carried out engineering experiments, used 3-D scanning equipment, sat on electric motorbikes, tested AI equipment, experimented with augmented reality and delved into motors and magnets (to name but a few!)

TeenTech gave our pupils the opportunity to try their hand at immersive challenges and experiments, to handle cutting edge technology and, most importantly, to spend time with engineers, technologists and scientists from a wide range of companies influencing their 21st- century lives.

Our pupils were a credit to the school and Midland Academies Trust as they immersed themselves in the workshop stages working 1:1 with industry professional and the technologies that these companies focus on. Later on the Hartshill teams smashed the design and engineering competition as our pupils won Best Digital Innovation, Winner in Super Safety, Winner of Best Physical Innovation and overall design winner Lydia and Tianna who won industry professional’s choice and then also voted as the pupil’s overall Best Design.

The TeenTech Festival was a powerful intervention before pupils make their GCSE subject choices, dispelling gender stereotypes and shifting perceptions of engineering careers. We are very proud of the HART values of Ambition and Tenacity that our pupils showed at this event.
